Pastor's Corner

As we go into the new year, it is important to keep a lot of things in our mind, and it can often be overwhelming. For example, I have been behind in getting this bit of the newsletter done for several days not (Kemper, again, I am very sorry for delaying your amazing work on the newsletter). We fall behind so quickly it seems in some aspects of our lives, but as we go throughout this new year let us strive to be better at a few things, to make a few resolutions that we can actually do and maintain. I believe that one that can guide us into a better life overall is the act of gratitude. It is something that seems to only occur when we are given or giving something, yet each day has things for which to be grateful.

2021 did not go quietly into the night, rather it seems like it went out swinging, and in the closing days we lost several icons of the world. Betty White passed away at 99, but she left these words about gratitude to guide us. "So, you may not be as fast on your feet, and the image in your mirror may be a little disappointing, but if you are still functioning and not in pain, gratitude should be the name of the game." —*Excerpt from her bestselling 2011 book, If You Ask Me (And of Course You Won't)*. It is all too often to focus in on what we have to complain about, and sometimes we need to complain. It's healthy to have people in our lives that we can complain to, and for those people I am so very grateful! But the gratitude for each sunrise and sunset, for the people that we see, and voices that we hear can make the hardships of life easier. The other icon whom the world lost at the end of 2021 was Archbishop Desmond Tutu. An activist in anti-apartheid movement in South Africa, he spoke often of justice and love through God and Christ. I highly suggest the *Book of Joy*, which is a recorded conversation between Archbishop Tutu and the Dalai Lama. In the section on gratitude, Desmond Tutu offers this as a guide for us. Gratitude is fundamental to joy. It, quite literally, allows us to generate our own happiness.

"Gratitude, is the recognition of all that holds us in the web of life and all that has made it possible to have the life that we have and the moment that we are experiencing." It allows us to shift our focus from what we lack to what we have. If acceptance is not fighting reality, gratitude means embracing it, counting blessings rather than burdens.

Our minds have a naturally negative bias—after all, being able to point out what is wrong or dangerous is advantageous to survival. But we need to be conscious of this, and purposeful in our gratitude. Our time on Earth is limited. Why waste it by miring ourselves in negativity?

Gratitude also connects us to others. When we are truly grateful, we remember all of those who help make our happiness possible, who bring goodness into our lives. We, then, are able to recognize those people, and enjoy them and their differences.

In this way, we can be made joyful by the world and people around us, instead of finding ourselves filled with anger and despair.

I hope that these words, from these legends of the world are able to guide you into the new year as we seek to show our gratitude for each new day, for each blessing that we receive and for each child of God we meet. Happy 2022!


From Committee on Congregational Life and Ministry

First, thank you to all that have contributed or donated to the pavilion building fund over the Christmas season. Due to unexpected delays, Morton Buildings (building contractor) is running behind schedule. Any new updates will be announced.



A YEAR END NOTE FROM THE TREASURER:

As we roll up on the year end for 2021, a couple of thoughts and sincere thanks to you all.

For lack of a better description, 2021 seems to be life imitating life. We lost a couple of old, dear friends; we hired a young, new minister that we all seem to be excited about; we continue to deal with a pandemic; and we remain a strong and committed church family.

The full financial report for 2021 will be presented as part of our annual meeting, but a couple of highlights:

Our budget for 2021 was approximately \$79,500 (based on not hiring a new minister); and we have collected to date \$122,828 in tithes and offerings; and have \$133,431 in total operating revenue to date.

Our budget for 2022 is \$130,057.

We received a brand new playground from an anonymous church family member. We have commenced on construction of a pavilion with an estimated cost of \$97,000 and we have already collected over \$43,000 for this project.

I certainly look forward to 2022, and sincerely thank you for all you have done and continue to do as the Mitchells Presbyterian Church family.
