Pastors Corner:

As we look to a new year, numbered two thousand and twenty-four, we prepare for all that may come our way. As Christian poet and pacifist Edith Lovejoy Pierce (1904-1983) puts it, "We will open the book. Its pages are blank. We are going to put words on them ourselves. The book is called opportunity, and its first chapter is New Year's Day." These blank pages of days yet to come, offer us the opportunity to live into our calling by Christ to work in ministry as we seek to uphold the teachings of Jesus. John 13:34-35 (NRSVue): 34 "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." This commandment is one of our guides as we seek to fulfill the great commission that Christ issues in Matthew 28:18-20, in which we are instructed to go out into the world on his behalf as Jesus is ascending into heaven. Our blank pages of the new year, should be inspired by what Jesus has taught us in the gospels, and this notion of moving outside of ourselves to show people God and the love that Christ has given to us, inspired January's hymn of the month, 'Lord, You Give the Great Commission".

Pastors Corner Continued:

Written by Jeffery Rowthorn to the tune of Abbot's Leigh by Cyril Vincent Taylor, the hymn fleshes out the words to Matthew 28 by tying them with many other quotations from Christ's ministry, such as: "Heal the sick and preach the word" Matthew 10:7–8; "I am with you to the end" Matthew 28:20; and "Father, what they do forgive" Luke 23:34. These quotes are themed in each line of the hymns as the writer focus on a type of blueprint for ministry or, for this Pastor's Corner, a way of filling each blank page. Line one states plainly the mission of the church as an entity that heals the sick and preaches the word as we provide witness to the world around us. Line number two focuses on our service in Christ's name, as we go out. Line three centers us on holy communion as we join together at the table, open to all whom desire to know Christ, with one another. Line four calls for us to put ourselves to work in creating a just society modeled after Christ's work of love and care; and finally, the fifth line brings us to eternity, following our service of faith, hope and love.

Hymn number 429 is often used during ministers' ordination service, or commissioning services for those going out to serve in mission or chaplaincy work. Its tune was written in the midst of World War Two from a British headquarters location in the village of Abbot Leigh, and with words written for the sending out young men and women from divinity school upon their graduation. A hymn that focuses on turning the page from where we are currently standing, to filling up the blank page of a new day as it was written both in tune and in lyrics. I hope that you enjoy January's hymn of the month, as we strive to set ourselves up to write on each of our blank pages!






There will be an estimated 13,200 new cases of cervical cancer diagnosed this year.


