Pastors Corner:

This year, we have found ourselves in a time in which Easter feels as though it has come exceptional early. For a timeline perspective, I preached Easter Sunday last year on the 9th of April, nearly 2 weeks later than 2024. Therefore, the month of March will be exclusively the Eastertide season this year. No other major Christian holiday will break into our lives during March, which means we have a unique opportunity to reflect upon how Eastertide (and for this year, fully the month of March) can inspire our faith journeys.

After reflecting for the 40 plus days of the Lenten season, we enter into the fullness of Holy Week, and we can be left exhausted by all that is held within the season. Yet, Eastertide brings us another counting of days, and another opportunity for spiritual and faith consideration. You see, while for many Easter is simply the weekend that begins with Good Friday and ends with Resurrection Sunday, or for the more secular folks Easter Monday (simply due to when the public holiday occurs); it is often forgotten that the full Easter periods BEGINS with resurrection Sunday and ends with Pentecost Sunday, a total of 50 days.

Eastertide (Easter Sunday to Pentecost) corresponds with the Jewish fests of Pesach, which we know as Passover, and the holiday of Shavuot [shah-voo-OTE], which is the holiday celebrating the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. The count is from the second night of Passover to the day of Shavuot, totaling 49 days, where we as Christians at the Sunday of Resurrection as our 50th day. These days in-between the feasts and Easter/Pentecost are known as the Counting of the Omer. This period marks the beginning of the barley harvest when, in ancient times, Jews would bring the first sheaves to the Temple as a means of thanking God for the harvest.

Pastors Corner, Continued:

The word omer literally means "sheaf" and refers to these early offerings. This time is based off the words of Leviticus 23:15-16. "You shall count from the eve of the second day of Pesach, when an omer of grain is to be brought as an offering, seven complete weeks. The day after the seventh week of your counting will make fifty days, and you shall present a new meal offering to God".

In Christianity, these 49-50 days are symbolic of the days that passed for the followers of Christ form Christ's resurrection to the Pentecost (the coming of the Holy Spirit during the ancient Shavuot celebration. Nowadays, it is meant to be, for us, a time of celebration, of prayer and of jubilation at the power of God and the resurrection of the Messiah as we prepare ourselves to celebrate the gift that is the Holy Spirit, which fills each of us and connects each of us to one another as well as to God Almighty and Jesus, our Messiah. It is a time that defined Christianity, as it bears witness to the risen Lord. Therefore this year's April is Eastertide, and Eastertide is our time to ponder on a crucial, though seldomly highlighted period of the Christian calendar as we count the days, leading us to our next encounter with the divine.



Session Report

January and March 2024 Session Meetings

Following the vote by the Congregation last fall, the Session members are now the Trustees of Mitchells Presbyterian Church, Inc., the business agent of Mitchells Presbyterian Church. At the January 2024 meeting the following Corporate Officers were elected:

Ann Walker -- President Roger Eakin -- Vice President Ron Evans -- Treasurer Steve Hicks -- Secretary

Session elected the following officers of the Church for 2024:

Ron Evans -- Treasurer Thomas Cuccherini -- Assistant Treasurer Steve Hicks -- Clerk of Session

Session approved the use of the Sanctuary on April 27th from 11:00 a.m. through 5:30 p.m. for the wedding of Cindy Graff and John East.

Session approved transferring 5% of the average balance of the Replacement Reserve Fund for Missions & Outreach use in 2024 on an as-needed basis.

The Audit Committee of Mary Lou Phillips, Posey Howell, and Kaye Inskeep reported to Session that they "found the accounting records for Mitchells Presbyterian Church to be in order for the calendar year 2023." Session adopted the Audit Committee report.

The Pastor was granted leave for: Continuing Education April 8-11 & October 8-14, and Vacation April 24-29 and May 22-29.

The following dates for Communion were approved:

February 4, 11, and 14; March 3, 24, 28, and 31 (Easter); April 7; May 5, 19, and 26; June 2; July 7; August 4, and September 1. Additional dates will be approved at future Session meetings.

Session requested that the Mission & Outreach Committee work with Graeme Tidman to fund a GriefShare program at Mitchells at an initial cost of \$600. More information will be forthcoming on this vital ministry.

Approval was given to the Buildings & Grounds Committee to purchase gutter guards for the rain gutters at a cost of \$3,000 and to also purchase asphalt crack sealer (final price unknown).

Tom Cuccherini thanked those who came out for the Saturday Clean-up day on March 9th .

Session approved a request from the Safety and Security Committee to pay for firearms simulation training for members of the Quick Response Team of the Church at an annual cost of \$780.

As a reminder, Session meets on the 2 nd Thursday of odd numbered months normally at 7:00 p.m.

Congregational Meeting Actions

At the Annual Congregational Meeting held Sunday, February 25, 2024 the Congregation approved the following:

Elected Conley Wallace, Patti Weaver, and Janet Miller to be Congregational members of the 2024 Nominating Committee.

Session members will be Carol Inskeep, Chair, and Kim Hicks.

The Congregation also voted to rescind the restriction placed on the proceeds from the sale of the manse in 2011 and allow those funds to be added to the Replacement Reserve Fund for future Church needs.

FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY:

Would you be interested in getting to know one another better? If there is enough interest, Congregational Life and Ministry (CLM) Committee will create random 4 x 4 groups each quarter.

The American Cancer Society's estimates for testicular cancer in the United States for 2024

are:

- About 9,760 new cases of testicular cancer diagnosed
- About 500 deaths from testicular cancer

The incidence rate of testicular cancer has been increasing in the US and many other countries for several decades. The increase is mostly in seminomas. Experts have not been able to find reasons for this. Lately, the rate of increase has slowed.

Testicular cancer is not common: about 1 of every 250 males will develop testicular cancer at some point during their lifetime.

The average age of males when first diagnosed with testicular cancer is about 33. This is largely a disease of young and middle-aged men, but about 6% of cases occur in children and teens, and about 8% occur in men older than 55.

Because testicular cancer usually can be treated successfully, a man's lifetime risk of dying from this cancer is very low: about 1 in 5,000.
